The office has also moved into Room 2 ready for the builders to start work next Monday bright and early.

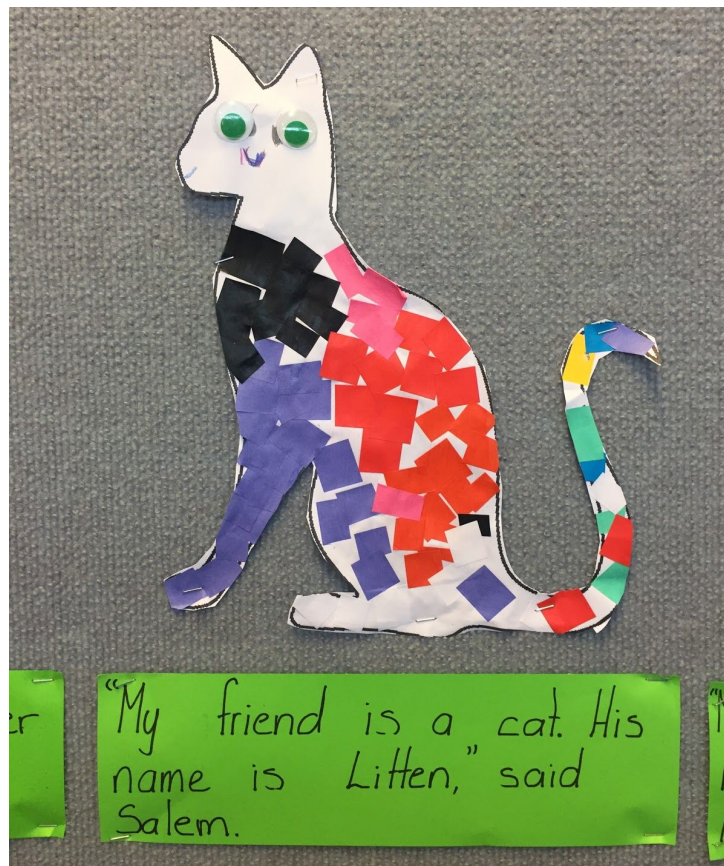
SPORTS CORNER
