The Board of Trustees will contribute \$25 for each student to play a sport but additional costs and codes must be met by whanau.

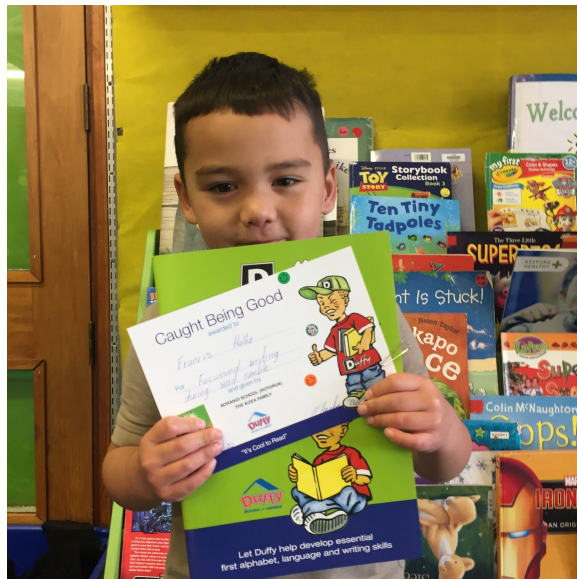
STUDENT ART

Room 10 created their Class Dojo avatars for art. This is Reagan Williams' wonderful artwork.

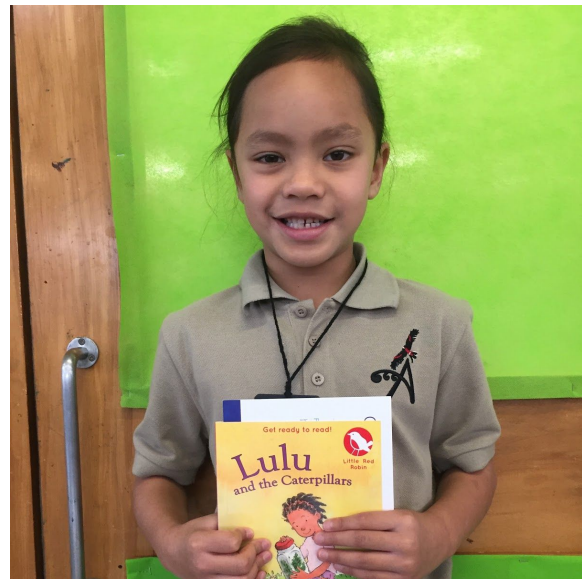

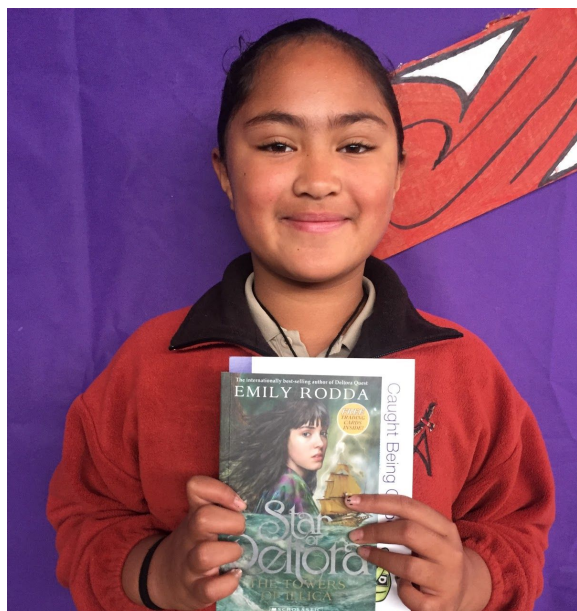

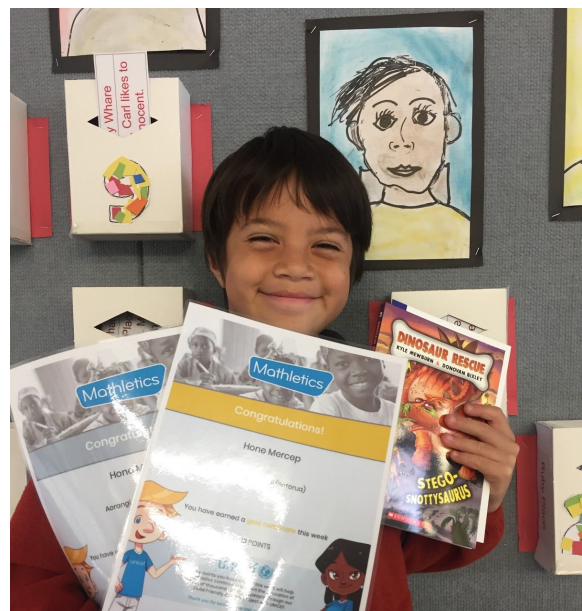

Focussed writing during word rumble.



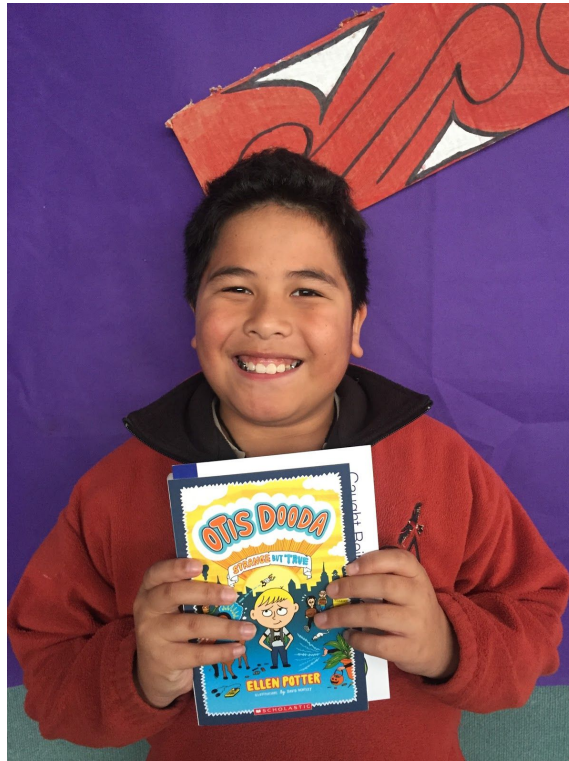
Hunter Anaru - R.6
