R.3 AND R.4 MUSEUM VISIT

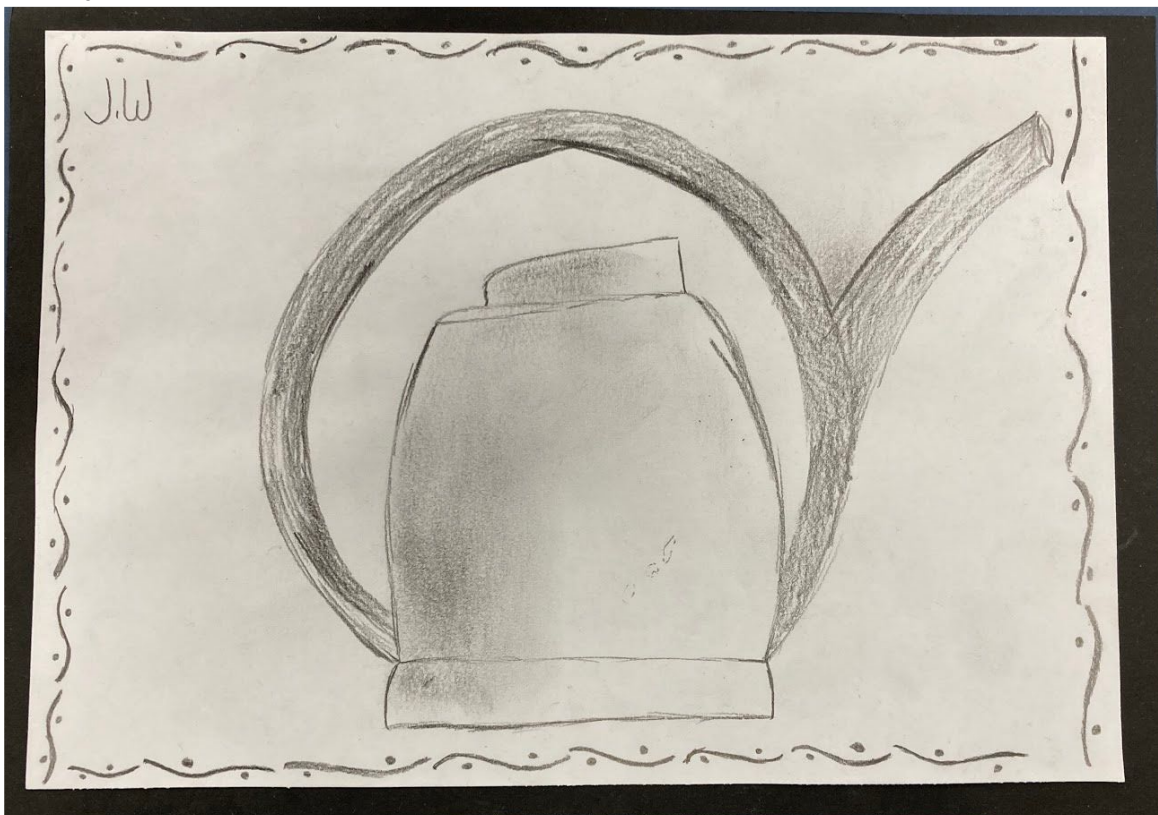

STUDENT ART

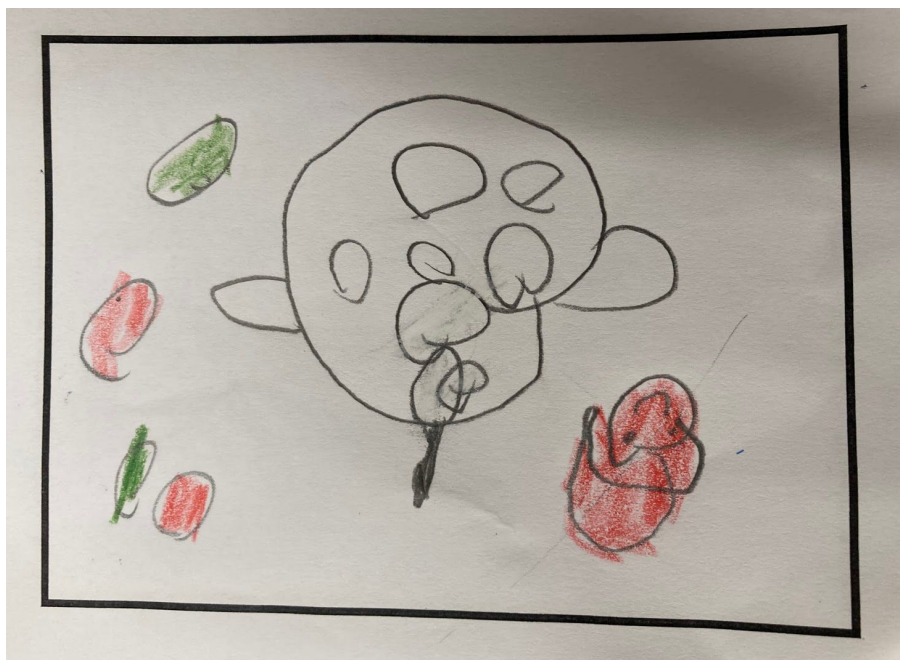
Room 3 has been doing some observational drawing. This is Jordyn Whare's drawing of a watering can. Lovely shading, Jordyn.
