SCULPTURE

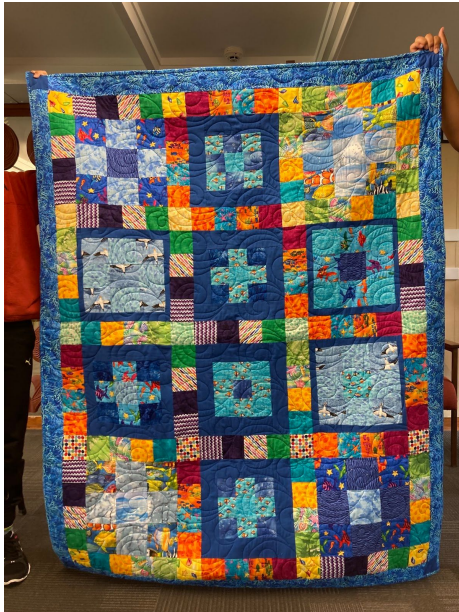


Recently, senior students participated in the Rotorua Museum sculpture workshop at The Arthouse.
